

# March of the Penguins

## Materials:

2 x 50g hanks of DK pure alpaca yarn – pale turquoise (A)  
50g hanks of DK pure alpaca yarn – gold (B), mid-blue (C)  
and cream (D)

## Needles:

1 pair of 5mm (UK 6; US 8) single-pointed knitting needles  
Large-eyed tapestry needle

## Instructions:

Make two.

Cast on 58sts in yarn A.

Knit into the back of the sts to form a neat edge.

Using the chart place pattern as follows:

Even row numbers are knit and odd numbers are purl.

Row 1: k2A, \*3B, 2A, 3B, 6A\* rep from \* to \* three times more.

Continue working from the chart until row 18. Cut off yarn

C. The rest of the knitting is done in yarn A.

Row 19: knit.

Row 20: purl.

Now continue in ribbing.

### Ribbing

Row 1: \*k2, p2\* rep until the last two sts, k2.

Row 2: \*p2, k2\* rep until the last two sts, p2.

Rows 3–20: Rep rows 1 and 2 nine more times.

Row 21: As row 1.

Row 22: Cast off sts.

### Making up

Use the tapestry needle to sew in loose ends by weaving them into stitches at the back of your work.

With right side facing, use a mattress stitch to join the side seams of the pattern component of the boot cuff.

Sew up the rib on the rear side of the boot cuff.
